








Prevalance of Disinformation



4-in-10 see disinformation almost every day

More than two-thirds of respondents (72%) reported coming across false news or information at least once a week, with 40% of Americans reporting they see false news almost every day.










Top 5 Sources that Participants Trust

Impact on Trust & Democracy



Nearly three-quarters of Americans say disinformation threatens democracy and undermines election processes

75% of Americans believe disinformation undermines the election process

74% feel it is a threat to democracy

73% believe it increases the polarization of political parties
